### Regional Awards & Mini-Grants:

- The *2023 NCRAL Region Award*, given in recognition of outstanding contributions to amateur astronomy, was presented to Brian Chopp of the Neville Public Museum Astronomical Society.
- The *2023 NCRAL Newsletter Editor Award* was presented to Paul Levesque of Popular Astronomy Club for editing *Reflections*.
- There were no applicants for this year's *NCRAL Affiliate-Recruitment or Membership-Recruitment Mini-Grants*.

### Region Administrative Updates:

- At its Spring 2023 convention, the Region approved a Messier Marathon Award program for observing 103 Messier objects in a single dusk-to-dawn night. Accommodations have been made for northern observers in the Region. The program includes certificates and pins. There are levels for 103 objects, both assisted and non-assisted, and for a minimum of 70 M-objects. There are gold stars (103 unassisted), silver stars (103 assisted), and bronze stars (70 any means). The Region will provide star pins and certificates.
- **The Region has updated its *Convention Planning Guide* during Spring 2023** to account for changes suggested by the COVID-19 pandemic and the impact of video-conferencing-based meetings and webinars on future attendance. - The Region formulated in Autumn 2022 detailed guidelines for nominating Region Award recipients. The guidelines can be found online at <https://ncral.wordpress.com/awards/>.
- **The Region held its NCRAL 2023 convention May 5-6, 2023, at Grand Bear Resort at North Utica, Illinois. The convention was hosted by the Twin City Amateur Astronomers, who hosted the event previously in 2010 and 2016. About 65 delegates attended this two-day event. The convention format focused on providing time for socialization. The theme was *Amateur Astronomy for Amateurs*. Focus was on workshops, seminars, panel discussions, and other face-to-face activities that a Zoom-based event usually does not provide. The convention netted a profit of \$524 for the Region.**
- **The Region has confirmed hosts for NCRAL conventions through 2024 only. The 2024 convention host will be the Neville Public Museum Astronomical Society. The event will be held at St. Norbert's College in De Pere, Wisconsin, May 17-18.**

### Electronic Communications:

- The Region has completed the seventh consecutive year of publishing its quarterly newsletter, **Northern Lights**. Back issues are accessible on the Region's website at <https://ncral.wordpress.com/newsletter-archive/>
- NCRAL utilizes a [self-subscribed email list](#) for disseminating the **Northern Lights** newsletter and other communications. Some 425 of the Region's approximately 1,900 members (22%) are subscribed. Despite regular promotions, the number of subscribers has increased very little over the years.

- Numerous affiliate members earned AL observing club pins and certificates during the year. These awards are recognized in the Region's newsletter.
- A small number of NCRAL members are taking advantage of the Region's seasonal Mini Messier Marathon.

#### **Star Parties & Club Events:**

- With the approval of the AL, affiliates have returned to conventions, public talks, and observing sessions, dispensing by in large with the use of personal protective devices, hand sanitizers, etc.

#### **NCRAL Objectives for 2023-2024:**

- The Region has formulated new objectives under new leadership. NCRAL Chair Alan Sheidler proposes the following, "I would like to use the concept of *Revitalization of Astronomy Clubs* as one theme. Another idea I would like to promote is improving the relationship and camaraderie between clubs. In addition, I would like to get to know more of the clubs in the region – visit them and promote Zoom meetings, observing sessions, and star parties. Also, I would like to encourage clubs to join the AL. There are several clubs that are not members (in the Region), and I would like to understand why that is – or convince them of the benefits of joining. Also, do we have any clubs in the Dakotas? If not, why not? There has to be a lot of opportunity there."
